Five days per week working with Kwiaht scientists in the field and laboratory for a total of six weeks of work, any time between May 1 and August 31, 2017.

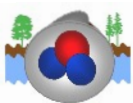
Receive a stipend of \$2,500 (roughly \$17 per hour that you are working and learning).
